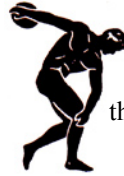
135 years young, the Los Angeles Turners are celebrating the milestone with a festive event, organized in tandem with the Goethe Institut.

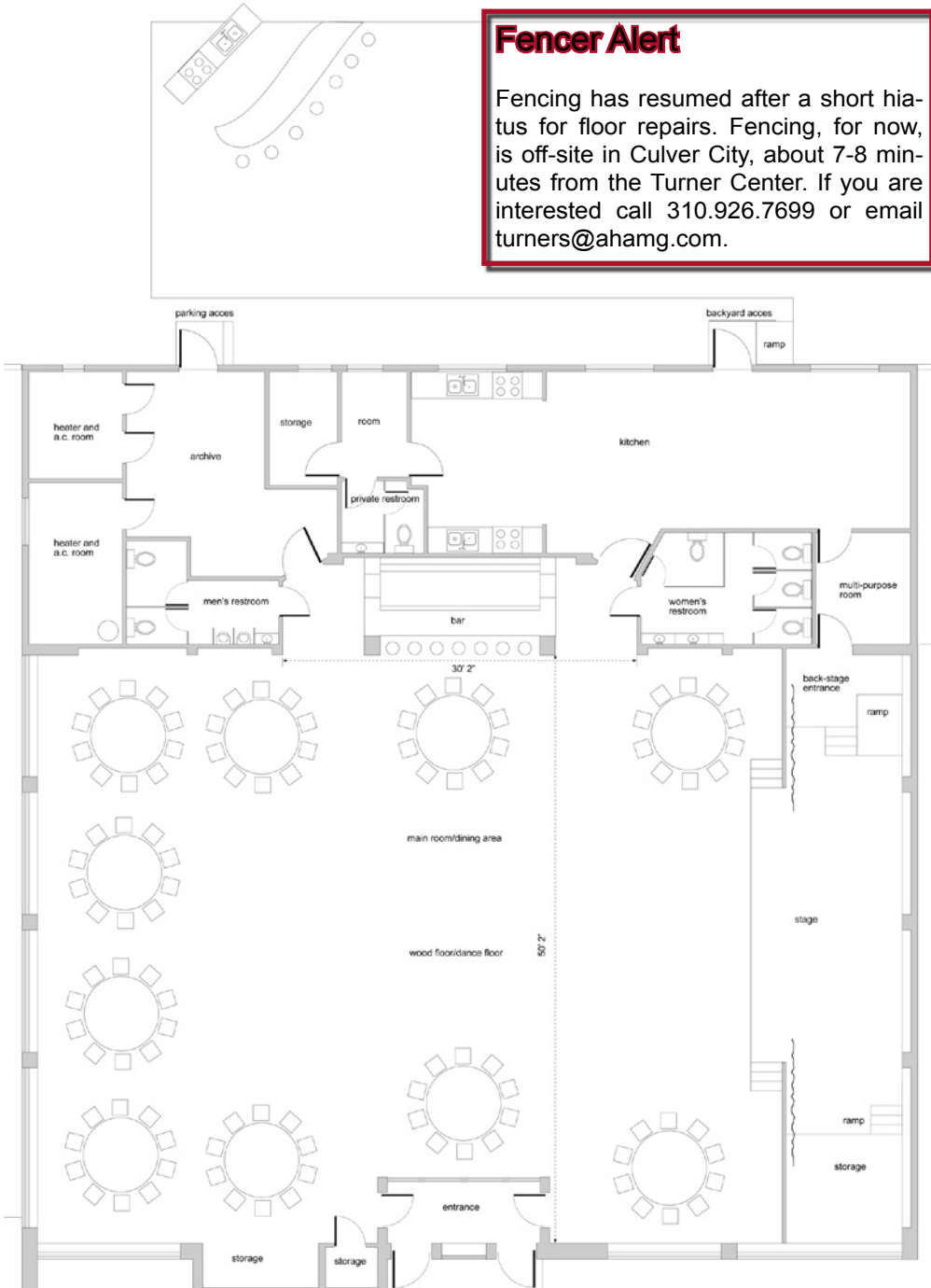
