Annual Assembly At Alpine - An Abstract

October 28 saw the yearly confab of the Los Angeles Turners, held at 3 PM at Alpine Village where once again, the issues of the day were robustly debated. Longtime Turners Christel Chang and Harry Herbert appeared after long absences, but in the Turner family, it was as if it was only yesterday. Two new members, two capable architects, Liliana and Andreas Gritschke, were initiated by the Dean of the Turners, Carl Schaefer.

President Dennis Fredricks, Membership Secretary Angie Hegedus, Bill Williamson for Treasurer Eliane Ubassy-Butler, American Turners and DAV rep Carole Brennan, and Choir Director Inge Crongeyer reported to the Turners in attendance. Each member also had the opportunity to review the annual financial report of the Society that was prepared by the Turners' accountant. Five numbered copies of the financial report were given to the members to examine. The membership

approved the report by acclamation. Bill Dinsenbacher suggested an interest bearing checking account. Hugo Bakos replied that only the minimum funds were kept in the checking account, so therefore interest from that balance would be minimal.

Elections for the three vacating Board posts were held. Alexander Hast nominated President Dennis Fredricks, CFO Eliane Ubassy-Butler and interior design artisan Corneliu Radulea for reelection. Bill Williamson asked for additional nominations from the floor.

Karen Imendorf asked if there was an opening on the board. Hugo Bakos stated that a spot will be up for election in one or two years and asked for a motion to close the nominations. Ilona Skarpidis made the motion and it was seconded.

Bill Dinsenbacher suggested that the three nominees should continue their work and that the membership should re-elect them. The three nominees were re-elected with one abstention by Christel Chang, and no opposing votes.

Dennis Fredricks announced the Turners' Christmas Party would be on December 11 at the Alpine Village's Emerald room at 6:30.

Richard Imendorf asked again to reinstate the quarterly meetings. He stated that he does not sing or fence, so the only information opportunities for him were the membership meetings.

Dennis offered that the January Board Meeting will be an open members' meeting. If there is quorum, the assembly will vote as a members' meeting. If not, it will still serve the purpose of offering information. The 2007 conclave adjourned at 5:07 PM.

Martin Luther. It is made out of branches of the fir tree (Tannenzweige). The wreath is decorated with red ribbons and has four red candles. It can be hung from the ceiling or be placed on the table.

The first Sunday after the 26th November (four Sundays before Christmas) is the first Advent (der erste Advent). On this Sunday, one candle is lit. Every following Sunday one more candle is lit until on the fourth Sunday all candles are lit - the fourth Advent. This custom symbolizes the coming of Christ with all his light and radiance.
