L.A. Turners return to the American Turners at National Conclave

After a long absence at the American Turners, the Los Angeles Turners were once again represented at the National Council Meeting of the national organization. LA Board member, Carole Kulzer Brennan went to the meeting held in Ft. Wayne, Indiana on September 14 and 15. During the first session she was elected District Representative-Western United States and will serve on the board of American Turners for the next 2 years. "I was warmly welcomed and my fellow representatives were appreciative and supportive of our resumed participation," Carole said. Her report to the board on the state of the Los Angeles Turners included "some ideas for a long range plan for Turner growth in the new house".

She reports that the Ft. Wayne Turners' location is an ample building set in a parklike setting. "Like most Eastern Turners, their emphasis is on various games played with balls, gymnastics, and Gemütlichkeit (Friday nights are very popular in their Ratskeller). Sorry, I didn't have my camera with me during the meetings, but I'll take lots of pictures next year during the National Convention."

Carole also reports that there are two active and very interesting programs in place:

one is a National Scholarship Program that granted 16 scholarships in 06-07 totaling \$32,000; and the other, part of the endowment trust fund, which supports the "Gym Grants" program and a "Computer Grants program. These are funding 8 gyms and 6 computer programs.

Common to all Turner societies, membership growth is a major issue. Many feel a need to de-emphasize women's competitive gymnastics. "On the other hand, the district rep for Wisconsin wanted to know what happened to the proposed match between LA Turner fencers and the Milwaukee challengers. I told her Milwaukee was not ready to face us!!"

The return to the American Turners was the initiative of President Dennis Fredricks, who weeks before, contacted American Turners President Bill Severns about the potential of restoring old ties with the 'national'. "President Severns was happy to see LA back, and Carole, with her positive spirit and legacy of Turnerism, was the ideal delegate" said Dennis. "We were very happy when she accepted the post".

Carole returned with fond compliments for the publication you are reading: "Our newsletter was singled out as the best one being printed. Thanks Alex and Dennis, for doing a great job."
