Dear Turners:

I certainly hope each of you enjoyed a very safe and blessed Holiday Season! As we enter into 2014, you should be aware of some notable changes starting with this issue of Turner Topics. The National Council has awarded Thrift-Remsen, a family owned and operated publishing company originating in 1938, located in Rockford, IL the opportunity to provide us with a quality product while saving our organization some expense. This first edition has a new look which we hope you'll enjoy reading. Your feedback is welcome.

Our new **Bylaws** and **Operational** formerly referred to as "An Extension of our Principles & Statutes" and the "Informational Brochure," will be submitted during the 2014 National Convention to be ratified as the governing documents of American Turners. Our Bylaws were structured by an attorney to insure that we're compliant in all local, state and federal laws and that it doesn't contain any verbiage that would put in jeopardy our non-for-profit and / or 501 C 3 statuses. Both of these documents have been completed although the Operational & Procedural Manual should be considered a 'living' document allowing for changes to be made as needed with approval of the National Council.

Another item of business will be to change the term of the National President from two 2-year consecutive terms to three 2-year consecutive terms. A resolution will be submitted requiring a 2/3 majority of the Federal votes cast to adopt.

The National Officers and Committee Chairs now have new business email addresses to use. We'd appreciate you using these new email addresses when communicating or requesting anything related to American Turners. The reasons for doing so are: 1) we appear professional in the way we correspond

internally between one another as Turners and more importantly, externally to our business partners and others outside our organization. And 2) those using these email addresses create a history of correspondence which can be invaluable to a new or incoming National Officer, Committee Chair or other elected or appointed individual. A list of the new email addresses and to whom they are presently assigned to can be found on this page. And since we're a non-for-profit organization, Microsoft has graciously waived any associated costs for using Office 365; a cloud-based email solution. Again saving our organization some expenses since this is a service that we once paid for. Your cooperation in using these new email addresses is greatly appreciated.

And, it's not too early to start making your plans to attend the next National Festival hosted by Aurora Turners in either the latter part of June or second week of July, 2015. Discussions have already taken place hoping to procure the same primary sites of Mooseheart (gymnastics & track& field competitions and possibly Cultural) and the Vaughan Center (swimming, volleyball). For those of you that were unable to attend the 2011 National Festival, you missed being part of one of the finest National Festivals held at the best facilities in the Fox Valley area. Together, let's make this next 2015 National Festival even better than the one held in 2011!

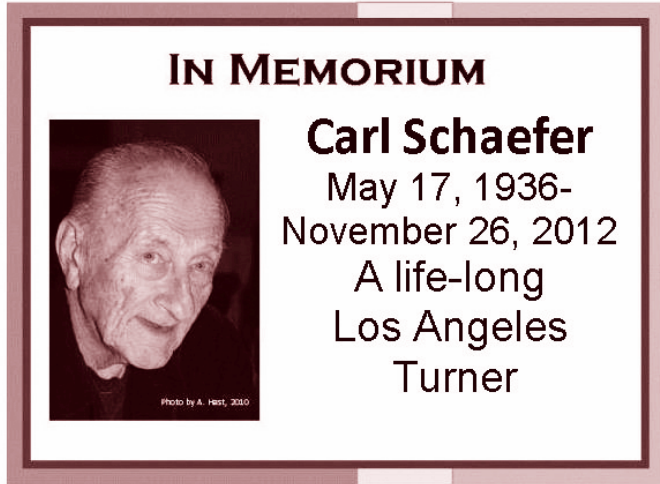

### MEMBERS RETURNED:

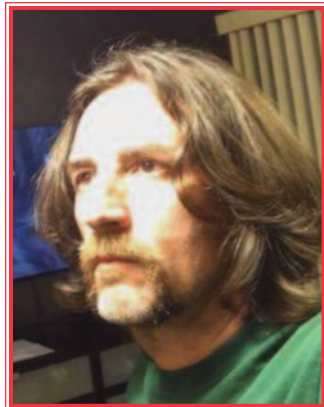

# ENDOWMENT TRUST

Effective January 1, 2014, the Endowment Trust of American Turners is happy to announce there are a total of 7 new and/or revised Grant Programs being offered to American Turners.

These programs include the *REVISED*:

“Physical Education Equipment Grant”

“Computer Equipment Grant”

“William R. Meyer Honorary Scholarship Award”

“Loans” (& checklist of requirements)

*NEW*:

“Startup Physical Education Grant”

“Instructors Safety Certification Grant”

“Society Reimbursement Grant”

There will also be a “Universal Application Form” available for use in applying for any one of these programs.

In each issue of Turner Topics this year we will detail some of these Grant Programs, how they function, their benefits and requirements for receiving such Grants. In this issue we cover the revised 50/50 Physical Education Grant and the 50/50 Computer Grant programs.

Both of these Grant Programs have been offered in past years. The format remains the same but the financial benefits have increased! The 50/50 Physical Education Grant now has a limit of \$8,000 that the Endowment Trust will share equally with qualified Societies. Any total amount exceeding \$8,000 will be the Society’s obligation to pay. The purpose of this grant is to enable Societies to purchase new apparatus, training aides and other gym items to maintain certified up-to-date equipment on behalf of students and instructors alike. The 50/50 Computer Grant remains the same except that the total the Endowment Trust will share has been raised to \$1,500 and anything exceeding that total is the Society’s obligation. The purpose of this grant is to give Societies the ability to have the latest in computer equipment that will be compatible with current programs in use by the National Organization.

Complete details on all the programs being offered by the Endowment Trust of American Turners can be found in the newly printed “Operating Manual” found on the American Turner website [www.amturners.org](http://www.amturners.org).

ALL grants and programs are renewable each calendar year and will be subject to change. You will note that much of the financial efforts being made by the Endowment Trust have been directed towards the Physical Education portion of American Turners. The Endowment Trust feels this is the very foundation upon which American Turners are based and directly supports our National motto of “A Sound Mind in A Sound Body.”

In the next issue of Turner Topics, we will detail the new “Physical Education Startup Grant” that is of importance to many Societies that have no current physical education program.

Please keep in mind that without your financial support, the Endowment Trust would not be able to provide these programs to American Turners. Your contributions are tax deductible.

## SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS FOR MEMBERS OF AMERICAN TURNERS

### GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The American Turners National Organization is offering a Scholarship Grant annually to its members that are working in a degree program at a fully accredited College or University. Only applicants who are planning to major in a Physical Education, Sports Medicine, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, or Recreational Therapy curriculum will be considered. Exceptions, however, are possible for students who have been involved over a number of years in Turner programs and pledge to continue service to the American Turners.
2. The By-laws of the American Turners provides the authority and purposes for the granting of Scholarship Awards by the American Turners. This By-law also provides that **“The Scholarship Committee of the American Turners shall develop a scholarship plan containing rules and regulations to determine the eligibility of the applicants seeking an award and a system of priorities to select the best possible candidates”**.
3. Scholarship recipients may apply for subsequent scholarships. However, they must submit a new application each year and meet all requirements to receive an additional scholarship.
4. A Scholarship Grant will be offered for the **Junior year** and **Senior year** only
5. Scholarships will only be awarded for Undergraduate College or University programs. No scholarships will be awarded for Post graduate programs, Professional or Trade Schools or for Community or Junior Colleges.
6. Majors are limited to: **Physical Education, Sports Medicine, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy or Recreational Therapy** only. Exceptions however, are possible, with other majors for students who have been involved over a number of years in American Turner programs and pledge to continue service to the American Turners.
7. Electronic courses pertaining to one of the five (5) majors listed in #6 must be offered by an accredited college or university.
8. Scholarship recipients may receive a maximum of two (2) scholarships. You may first apply going into your Junior year of study. If for some reason your application was denied going into your Junior year, you may then re-apply going into your Senior year.
9. The completed Application for an American Turner Scholarship must be received by the National Office of the American Turners postmarked no later than July 1st of any given year. Any applications received after July 1st will be returned to the applicant and will have to be resubmitted for consideration the following year.
10. All applications postmarked by July 1<sup>st</sup>, and qualified by membership, will be screened by the American Turners National Office and then forwarded to the National Scholarship Committee (NSC). The NSC will then review each application to determine if the applicant meets all the requirements as stated in these rules. The NSC has the final decision in the awarding of scholarships.
11. The National Scholarship Committee shall determine the number and amounts of Scholarships to be awarded each year.
12. After an application for an American Turners Scholarship Grant has been approved, the National office will make payment of ½ of the total amount of the Scholarship Grant paid directly to the College’s or University’s Admissions Office, Registrar’s Office or Financial Aid Office as indicated on the Application For American Turner Scholarship form chosen in the name of the applicant. The second ½ of the total amount of the Scholarship Grant will then be paid at the beginning of the second semester to the respective College or University upon notification from the school that the applicant is still enrolled as a full time student in good standing, and the submission of a transcript of grades for the completed semester along with a schedule of classes for the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.
13. If the applicant’s Major or accredited College or University changes after the application was approved, the American Turner’s National Office and/or the National Scholarship Committee must be notified.

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## SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS FOR MEMBERS OF AMERICAN TURNERS

### REQUIREMENTS OF APPLICANTS

#### Check List

1. The applicant must be a member for a minimum of twelve (12) months prior to July 1<sup>st</sup> of any given year and be in good standing with his or her Society; Memberships at Large included. The official membership anniversary date is the date printed by the National Office on the annual membership card.
2. A scholastic recipient may receive a maximum of two (2) scholastic awards. If you are entering your Junior year, you may apply for a scholarship. You may apply for a scholarship award going into your Senior year whether you received a previous award or not, or if this is your first time applying for an award.
3. The applicant's Major must be in one of the five (5) fields: Physical Education, Sports Medicine, Physical Therapy, Occupational, or Recreational Therapy. Alternatively, the scholarship committee may consider other majors for candidates who have been involved in American Turner programs over a number of years and pledge to continue service to the American Turners.
4. The applicant must submit a transcript of completed grades from the prior year of the College or University he or she has Attended as in the case of a transfer, or is currently attending. Additionally, the student must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 grade point scale or a 3.5 on a 5.0 grade point scale for each semester. A minimum of twelve (12) credit hours or its equivalent must be maintained for the duration of the scholarship.
5. Applicants must secure endorsement from both their respective Turner Society President and their District President. These signatures must appear on the application form before the application is submitted to the American Turners National Office for consideration of the National Scholarship Committee.
6. The applicant must submit with the application form, a Fall registration schedule for the selected College or University (such College or University must be recognized and located in the United States); the school within the College or University. The same is expected for the Spring semester.
7. The applicant must also submit with the application form an estimated cost for tuition & books for the year. And, please submit the address and phone number of the institution's Admission's, Registrar's or Financial Aid's Office of the selected College or University where the Scholarship Grant is to be remitted.
8. The applicant must submit a written essay of at least one typewritten page titled "How I Am Involved in the American Turners Today and What My Plans are for Involvement in the American Turners in the Future."
9. The applicant must submit a letter of recommendation from a society officer noting how the student has been involved in their society.
10. The applicant must complete a minimum of twelve (12) hours of volunteered service within his or her Society. If a Turner Hall is not available, a minimum of twelve (12) hours of community service must be performed in the name of American Turners in the same calendar year when the application is submitted. The minimum hours of service must be completed by July 1<sup>st</sup> of any given year. The completed number of service hours must be approved by either the Turner Society President or the community representative.
11. ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTS must be sent to the American Turners National Office and post marked no later than July 1<sup>st</sup> of any given year.
